

## ABCT Grants Programme Application form for Conservation grants

Please note that:

- You may use this form to apply for up to £2,500 for the conservation, restoration or introduction of historically, socially, technically, architecturally, and/or archaeologically important airfield artefacts
- Items must be sustainably managed, displayed and interpreted for the public, therefore the public must have access to the asset directly or through visual representation, e.g. available to view online
- The applicant organisation must be a non-profit organisation such as a trust, charity, CIC etc. Grants are not available to individual persons or private companies. Your organisation must have its own bank account which requires two unrelated people to authorise cheques and make withdrawals
- If the grant is used as part-funding for a project, the remaining funding must already have been secured in order for ABCT to consider your application
- Any ABCT grant must be publicly acknowledged with our logo, for example on an information leaflet or on your website. Funding may be subject to other conditions as agreed with your organisation.
